How do you tie your shoes when you have only one hand? How do you use a knife and fork? And, when you're 13 and blind, what assumptions do people make about you? Find out in *Mark's Moments*, a "day in the life" series of shorts, as host Mark Sykes spends time with various kids with disabilities.

"We are more capable than you probably think," remarks Niall, age 13, born with minimal vision but now fully blind. Niall demonstrates how he crosses the street, how he stays active (trampolining and rock climbing are just two of his pastimes!), and discusses the hardest things he has to deal with on a daily basis. In another episode we meet Alex, age 12, a right-hand amputee since birth. Alex challenges Mark to a shoe-tying contest, and, after preparing a tasty snack of French toast, he shows Mark how he uses a knife and fork with only one hand.

Each child has friends and family, chores to complete, and personal interests. And as young viewers get a glimpse into the lives of children with disabilities, they discover that these children are not much different from themselves.
